BCSSA Policies and Procedures Manual #3 of 3 June 2022

SECTION A – COMPETITIONS AND EVENTS POLICIES, PROCEDURES AND REGULATIONS

A-1 POLICY: The Authority Level of Competitions and Events Policies, Procedures and Regulations

- 1. Competitions and Events Policies and Procedures of SSBC cannot contravene the BC Societies Act, current provincial or national laws, or the SSBC Constitution and Bylaws.
- 2. Competitions and Events Policies and Procedures should align with the Organizational Management and Sport Technical Policies and Procedures.
- 3. Clubs and individuals who are members of SSBC agree to abide by the Constitution and Bylaws, and all Policies and Procedures of the SSBC.

SECTION B – CLUB COLOURS

B-1 POLICY: Club Colours

- 1. The SSBC Board will approve the colours to be used by clubs for their racing suits and team wear,
- 2. In the case of a club becoming dormant or extinct, colours assigned to that club shall not be reassigned for a period of at least three (3) years in case such club is revived.

SECTION C - COMPETITIVE CATEGORIES

C-1 POLICY: Age Classes

1. Skater age classes will be in accordance with the SSC Competitions and Events Regulations - Section B1-200

C-1 POLICY: Selection of Team BC

1. SSBC will name teams for Speed Skating Canada events in accordance with the SSC and

SSBC Competitions Bulletins, published annually

E-2 POLICY: Championship Medals

1. Medals will be awarded at Provincial Championships.

F-1 POLICY: Sanctioned Competitions

1. The types of available sanctions will be defined in the Competition Sanction Overview reviewed and published annually.

SECTION F - COMPETITION SANCTIONING .

F-1 POLICY: Rules Jurisdiction

- 1. Competitions shall follow the rules of speed skating as per the ISU and SSC as well as formats as outlined in the annual SSBC Competition Bulletin.
- 2. Other format changes may be enacted as determined by the SSBC Board.

SECTION G- COMPETITION RULES

G-1 POLICY: Competition Protocols

- 1. Competition protocols are to be submitted upon completion of the competition to SSBC for posting and database entry,
- 2. In the event of multiple day events, the summary results of each day should be posted.

SECTION H – HOSTING GUIDELINES

H-1 POLICY: Hosting

1. Local Competitions

- a. Local Competitions include Time Trials, Mini Meets and FUNales.
- b. The Competition Sanction Overview will be reviewed and published annually.

2. Regional Competitions

- a. Regional Competitions include Time Trials and Interclubs.
- b. By September 1st of each year, clubs will communicate with SSBC the dates of Interclubs they will host. Clubs will also indicate at this time if they require support from SSBC Officials Development Committee for these meets.
- c. The Competition Sanction Overview will be reviewed and published annually.

3. Provincial Hosting

- a. Speed Skating BC, in coordination with local clubs, will host provincial events including:
 - i. Provincial Competitions and Academies
 - ii. Provincial Championships,
 - iii. SSBC Annual General Meetings.

b. The Competition Sanction Overview will be reviewed and published annually.

H-2 POLICY: National and Interprovincial Competitions

- 1. Speed Skating Canada is the sanctioning body which sanctions National or Interprovincial events.
- 2. National or Interprovincial events held in BC must also apply for a SSBC sanction
- 3. When bidding for a National Competition, BC Clubs must advise SSBC's Technical Director or Executive Director prior to bidding.
- 4. The Competition Sanction Overview will be reviewed and published annually.

SECTION I – MEDICAL COVERAGE AND PROTOCOLS

I-1 POLICY: Medical Coverage at Sanctioned and Non-Sanctioned Competitions and Events

- 1. Protecting the safety of speed skaters is the primary concern of all members of the SSBC.
- 2. The medical services that should be provided during Competitions and Events are set out in the Competition Sanction Overview Document which is updated annually.
- 3. Medical Coverage for all the speed skating activities is outlined in the "British Columbia Speed Skating Association Medical Requirements/Protocol" document, which is based on the SSC Red Book.
- 4. All participants in SSBC events must be registered members.
