

Provincial Coaching Coordinator

Overview

As a key member of the Speed Skating BC Team, the goal of the Provincial Coaching Coordinator (PCC) will be to work with our GenBC skaters in partnership with their Daily Training Environment (DTE) Coaches to ensure skaters have all the tools of a performance program to prepare them for competition and to achieve their personal goals. The PCC will also represent Team BC as the Provincial Head Coach for Team BC at identified provincial, regional and national events.

This position provides a unique opportunity to coach a dynamic group of skaters and guide them to their next level of skating, but also to provide support and mentorship to coaches in our province.

With experience in both Short Track and Long Track Speed Skating the PCC will be responsible for:

- Ensuring all BC Canadian Sport Institute Pacific carded athletes have a Yearly Training Plan including measurable Key Performance Indicators.
- Regular consultation with athletes and their coaches to track their progress and to ensure they are aware of Integrated Service Team and CSI services to supplement their DTE
- Facilitating athletic testing where needed
- Cooperative consultation with DTE coaches to support the coaching needs of the athletes
- Coordinating and planning the programming for Academy and other training opportunities such as the PACK and "I Can Skate Fast" programs.
- Coordinating Team BC uniform distribution
- Coordinating and submitting Team BC event entries
- Coaching at identified Team BC events
- Providing mentorship to coaches when appropriate
- Exemplifying and encouraging a positive and encouraging coaching environment for SSBC

Qualifications

- A minimum Competition Development Certification in Speed Skating
- Experience coaching in a performance setting for both Long Track and Short Track disciplines.

- Completed all minimum coaching credentials for BC including, Safe Sport and Making Headway in Speed Skating courses
- Clear Vulnerable Sectors Records Check
- Experience mentoring coaches
- Demonstrated leadership qualities in sport
- Strong interpersonal skills and ability to work independently as part of a remote team.

Working Environment and Expectations

This position is a full time position. Program time (approximately 80%) would be spent in the following programs:

- 8% GenBC Dev Program (including outreach/mentorship with daily training environment coaches)
- 50% GenBC Program (including outreach/mentorship with daily training environment coaches)
- 30% Team BC (event coaching, Team BC logistics, mentorship of assistant Team BC coaches)
- 12% Academy camps, PACK camps, I Can Skate Fast delivery
- Other projects as required

It is anticipated that this position will also be responsible for a number of administrative tasks (20%) that are commensurate with the outcomes including meetings with staff, committees and the Board.

The PCC will be expected to travel extensively to competitions, events and training both in BC and Canada.
